Youth Ambassador Pilot Program Time Line

2017	Key Result Activities
January and February	Key stakeholder consultation with committee links and schools to identify and recruit 20 young people.
January	Present the Pilot Program to the White Ribbon Programs Team to ensure cross portfolio alignment.
January	Meet University of Wollongong to advise on the project and seek thoughts on ethics, surveys, evaluation planning and risk management.
March	Present the Pilot Project as part of 2017 strategic planning to the White Ribbon North East Committee to ensure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Project scoping / program logic development • Agree key contacts across the areas identified • Agree Breaking the Silence Schools to engage
March	Hold a launch event with key stakeholders providing an information session. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The University of Wollongong to present: Kenton Bell • Meet some of the young people interested and seek their feedback • Identify possible ambassador mentors
March	Meet local stakeholders who will act as satellites on project commencement: Councils
March	Meet services for training: Goulburn Women's Health, Benalla Health and the Hume Indigenous Family Violence Regional Action Group.
April	Recruitment Drive and Reference Checking
May	Register 20 young men as supporters and commence pre-survey engagement
May	Provide consent forms to all 20 young men assuring (anonymous) information collected with the surveys and over the course of the program might also be necessary to be built-in with other forms at program commencement, and a reminder of their rights as participants appearing again prior to the follow-up evaluation at program end.
May / June Half Day Session	Train 20 young men on 'Understanding men's violence against women.' This training will be undertaken and in collaboration with Goulburn Women's Health and Benalla Health. White Ribbon Community Officers Hikari So and Alex Taylor Pitcher will also help support and drive White Ribbon Training as well as Facilitation and Engagement Lead Dale Palmer.

	<p>Further, a training resources will be produced for all of the young men so they can access information, resources and local services information should they need it at any time during and post training.</p> <p>The 20 young men will learn about:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Understanding men's violence against women Impact of men's violence against women Causes of men's violence against women Debunking myths about men's violence against women Primary prevention Managing disclosures Standing up to violence
May Half Day Session	Sporting Round with the Hume Indigenous Family Violence Regional Action Group will take place – all 20 young men will be invited to join in the days activities – details TBC.
June 15 mins phone session	Telephone initiation as Case Management to: Mentors and Mentees (young men) to ensure effective communication and clear access points.
July Half Day Session	Support twenty young men to publically take the White Ribbon Oath: I will stand up, speak out and act to prevent men's violence against women. The oath taking will be supported and led by the North East Committee who will take the oath with the young men at a hosted event: http://www.whiteribbon.org.au/host-event . This will also be welcomed and promoted by local press and media.
August Half Day Session	<p>Resource Consultation and Development Session: Support the development of young people led resources and information on e.g. how to get involved with White Ribbon, 'calling out' sexist jokes, how to call the police if violence is witnessed and how to manage a disclosure. Here are various examples here: http://www.whiteribbon.org.au/resources/facts. North East Committee, Ambassadors and Schools to help facilitate. Videos and online content will be developed and localised.</p>
August to November Minimum: One Day	Provide and seek volunteering opportunities and pathways for the young men to support relevant and local community activations as part of primary prevention initiatives for the potential for significant or direct community impact and benefit, and broader implementation across the three areas identified: Shepparton, Benalla and Wangaratta. Volunteering opportunity access points will be provided through White Ribbon Schools and the North East Victorian Committee. The young men will support a community activity related to ending violence against women as part of this pilot program e.g. help a local charity as

	young male role models or support some of the work undertaken by the North East Victorian Committee. This supports a collaborative approach and showcases young men as role models further supporting the independent evaluation of the ambassador program.

September Half Day Session	<p>Bystander workshop with Gouburn Women's Health, White Ribbon Community Officers and Ambassadors/Committee. Provide a workshop session on what it means to be a safe bystander. This will be conducted by a White Ribbon Ambassador who can inspire, lead and engage the young men. As such, the session will support the young men to act as positive role models and be a part of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • challenging assumptions about gender and power • changing beliefs and attitudes about men and women • managing feelings and accepting responsibility • helping to resolve conflict • knowing the difference between abusive and non-abusive relationships • the consistent message that abuse is not acceptable • understanding that abuse is a crime • highlighting the role of peers in providing support • providing information about where to get help
September to November	Continued resource development project work ready for White Ribbon Day execution and launch.

February	Post survey work and initiate independent evaluation working with the University of Wollongong and the White Ribbon Research and Impact Manager.
